Bemis Cultures of Thinking Visit...

Last week Lindsey, Julie D. and I got to participate in a valuable professional development opportunity. Bemis staff shared their journey through CoT. They were where we are today, about four years ago. I encourage you to talk to Lindsey and Julie about their thoughts.

Two of the fifth grade students shared testimonials of of the changes in their learning and how they saw their teachers evolve through CoT. Equally powerful was that the entire building was open to visitors. Nobody was left out of this event. Each classroom, even those with long term substitutes, modeled lessons, and displayed work that was more about the process than the product. Discussions were about extending thinking, not just getting to the "right" answer. Students were engaged and interactions showed evidence of well-practiced routines.

One teacher shared her story of initial frustrations and skepticism of CoT. Through close collaboration with grade level and vertical teams, modeling and practicing the routines over and over, and looking at student work as a building, she saw the growth that her students made. She said it refreshed her as a teacher and totally changed the way she delivered instruction and managed her classroom.

What struck me in this visit were the parallels that I see at Costello. Have you seen the work in our hallways? Have you ventured into another grade level to see the "MR. POLITE" CoT in action? There is so much to see and learn just from walking through our building. I love the way the Costello staff embraces challenges as a team.

The conversations that you are having are not always about what is going right in relation to CoT, but they are about the struggles, frustrations, and questions you are facing after trying something out that didn't go as planned. One of the Bemis teachers remembered being in precisely the same spot his first year of implementation. After talking with one another, trying a new approach, etc. more often than not your reflections highlight the results and growth. This reflective practice lines up with the CoT goals that we established at the beginning of the year.

I applaud each of you for the energy and excitement you bring to our monthly meetings with Ellen and the optional "coffee talks." I also know that there is far more conversation going on beyond these meetings. I want to thank each of you for your commitment to developing your classroom into a Culture of Thinking classroom. The momentum that you carry through your enthusiasm makes an impact on both your students and your colleagues. THANK YOU for all that you do! This IS the right work and I have no doubt that the visitors who come to Costello will walk away WOWed!
